

# CSCC Match Play Rules

The match play competitions will be posted by June 25th. Each round is to be played by the deadline, with the final competition to be held on or prior to Labour Day weekend.

The draws, rules and Handicaps will be emailed to members as well as on the Cedar Springs website.

All Tournament rules apply - drops, out of bounds, unplayable, red stakes and PLAY THE BALL WHERE IT LIES. No winter rules, tipping etc.

Before teeing off, players agree upon the number of additional holes to be played if the match is tied after 9 holes.

If you have not posted 5 cards since 2021, you will be playing with a "0" handicap.

Updated Handicaps will be posted July 1, July 15, August 1, and August 15, 2022.

Please adhere to the deadline rules.

Final matches are 18 holes

Upon completion, update the draw and email Debbie Conacher with the match result.

# Couples Match Play Rules

## Handicap calculation

Add each member of a couples handicaps together. Take the difference between the couples handicaps, multiply that difference by .33, and round up or down to the nearest whole number. The result is the number of strokes the lower handicap couple must give the higher handicap couple in the match, on the most difficult handicap holes.

### Example

Couple A have a combined handicap of 22.

Couple B have a combined handicap of 16.

Difference is 6

$6 \times .33 = 1.98$  (round up to 2)

Couple B gives Couple A one stroke on each of the two hardest Red tee holes (#1, #5)

Use Red tee handicaps for scoring.

Couples golf is an alternate shot format.

Women tee off from Red tees on even numbered holes.

The man tees off from the odd numbered holes using white or blue tees (the tees he regularly plays from, that his handicap is based on).

If the women hits her drive into an area that does not have red stakes, the man should tee off from the tees he would normally hit from - blue or white.

Upon completion, update the draw and email Debbie Conacher with the match result.

# Parent/child Match Play Rules

## Handicap calculation

Use adult handicaps and children play with 0 handicaps.

Take the difference between the parent's handicaps, multiply that difference by .33, and round up or down to the nearest whole number. The result is the number of strokes the lower handicap team must give the higher handicap team in the match, on the most difficult handicap holes.

Use Red tee handicaps for scoring.

Parent/child golf is an alternate shot format.

Children tee off from Red tees on even numbered holes.

Parents tee off from the odd numbered holes that he normally plays from (that his handicap is based on).

If the child hits his/her drive into an area that does not have red stakes, and the unplayable ball rule would not apply, the parent should tee off from the tees he would normally hit from.

Upon completion, update the draw and email Debbie Conacher with the match result.

# 18+ Men's Match Play Rules

## Handicap calculation

Take the difference between the players handicaps, multiply that difference by .67, and round up or down to the nearest whole number. The result is the number of strokes the lower handicap player must give the higher handicap player in the match, on the most difficult handicap holes.

### Example

Player A is an 8 handicap

Player B is a 3 handicap

Difference is 5

$5 \times .67 = 3.35$  (round down to 3)

Player B gives Player A one stroke on each of the three hardest white tee holes (#1, #5, and #8)

Use white tees.

Upon completion, update the draw and email Debbie Conacher with the match result.

# 60+ Men's Match Play Rules

## Handicap calculation

Take the difference between the players handicaps, multiply that difference by .67, and round up or down to the nearest whole number. The result is the number of strokes the lower handicap player must give the higher handicap player in the match, on the most difficult handicap holes.

### Example

Player A has a handicap of 12.

Player B has a handicap of 7.

Difference is 5

$5 \times .67 = 3.35$  (round down to 3)

Player B gives Player A one stroke on each of the 3 hardest Blue tee holes (#1, #5, #4)

Men use Blue tees and Blue handicaps for scoring.

Upon completion, update the draw and email Debbie Conacher with the match result.

# 18+ Women's Match Play Rules

## Handicap calculation

Take the difference between the players handicaps, multiply that difference by .67, and round up or down to the nearest whole number. The result is the number of strokes the lower handicap player must give the higher handicap player in the match, on the most difficult handicap holes.

## Example

Player A is an 8 handicap

Player B is a 3 handicap

Difference is 5

$5 \times .67 = 3.35$  (round down to 3)

Player B gives Player A one stroke on each of the three hardest white tee holes (#1, #5, #4)

Use Red tees.

Upon completion, update the draw and email Debbie Conacher with the match result.

# 60+ Women's Match Play Rules

## Handicap calculation

Take the difference between the players handicaps, multiply that difference by .67, and round up or down to the nearest whole number. The result is the number of strokes the lower handicap player must give the higher handicap player in the match, on the most difficult handicap holes.

### Example

Player A is an 8 handicap

Player B is a 3 handicap

Difference is 5

$5 \times .67 = 3.35$  (round down to 3)

Player B gives Player A one stroke on each of the three hardest white tee holes (#1, #5 and #4)

Use Red tees.
